Case Coordination

Persons struggling with addictive behavior require and deserve careful attention. With appropriate training and experience, professionals are able to assess individual situations and determine appropriate avenues of treatment.

Assessment and Treatment Options

- Ability to tailor both assessment and treatment to each individual.
- Referral to the appropriate medical, psychological, psychiatric and rehabilitation providers.

Treatment Selection

- Close familiarity with a wide range of local and national treatment facilities.
- Based on this first-hand knowledge of these facilities, appropriate suggestions are made which take into account each person's pertinent social and economic needs. Insurance issues and other details are dealt with as needed.

After Care

- Ability to provide links to supportive living providers, half-way houses and twelve-step programs.

- Plans are developed which include both treatment and monitoring.
